PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING NATIONAL RECOVERY MONTH

WHEREAS, behavioral health is an essential part of health and one's overall wellness; and

WHEREAS, prevention of mental and or substance use disorders works, treatment is effective, and people recover in our area and around the nation; and

WHEREAS, preventing and overcoming mental and/or substance abuse disorders is essential to achieving healthy lifestyles, both physically and emotionally; and

WHEREAS, we must encourage relatives and friends of people with mental and/or substance abuse disorders to implement preventive measures, recognize the signs of a problem, and guide those in need to get appropriate treatment and recovery support services; and

WHEREAS, in 2014, 1 in 3 local high school students self-reported that they felt so sad and hopeless almost every day for two weeks or more; and

WHEREAS, youth substance abuse in the Valley is on a decline and yet we still have 31% of our 11th grade students reporting that they have used alcohol within the past 30 days and 22% of students have used e-cigarettes or illicit drugs within the last 30 days; and

WHEREAS, in 2013, 2.5 million people aged 12 or older received substance use treatment and 34.6 million adults received mental health services, according to the 2013 National Survey on Drug Use and Health. Given the serious nature of this public health problem, we must continue to reach out to those who need help.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Holly Sierra, Mayor of the City of Buellton, on behalf of the Buellton City Council, hereby proclaim the month of September 2015 as NATIONAL RECOVERY MONTH and encourage all citizens to embrace the belief that prevention works, treatment is effective, and people can recover.

Subject: Resolution No. 15-24 – “A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Buellton, California, Regarding Parking Restrictions on West Highway 246 at Valley Station Drive”

BACKGROUND

The City received a request from Buellton residents for parking restrictions on Highway 246 west of Valley Station Drive due to safety concerns. Vehicles attempting to exit from Valley Station Drive have difficulty seeing eastbound traffic due to trucks parked on Highway 246 throughout the day.

Staff has reviewed the request and performed field visits to review site conditions and also discuss the parking and traffic safety issues with two businesses in the area. It was found that several vehicles, including trucks, park all day in this area. During discussions with local businesses, it was noted the bus stop east of Valley Station Drive created safety concerns as well, but it was noted that these stops are temporary for pick-up and drop-off a few times a day and would not create a long-term issue. The businesses also mentioned there were numerous locations along Highway 246 with similar safety concerns; however, the City is only reviewing this particular location at this time.

Vehicles parking on Highway 246 west of Valley Station Drive do limit the line of sight of vehicles making traffic movements. The typical line of sight distance is 250 feet in a 35mph speed zone per the Caltrans Highway Design Manual. To be consistent with similar existing parking restrictions within the City limits, and to improve the line of sight, staff recommends installation of 145 feet of red curb on Highway 246 west of the Valley Station Drive. This would bring the parking restriction to the next existing driveway approach. Exhibit A to Resolution No. 15-24 notes the proposed red curb area.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approval of curb painting will have minimal Fiscal Impact as the markings can be completed by staff or others.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Council approve Resolution No. 15-24– “A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Buellton, California, Regarding Parking Restrictions on West Highway 246 at Valley Station Drive”

RESOLUTION NO. 15-24

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUELLTON, CALIFORNIA, REGARDING PARKING RESTRICTIONS ON WEST HIGHWAY 246 AT VALLEY STATION DRIVE

WHEREAS, certain portions of the Santa Barbara County Code, including Chapter 23: Motor Vehicles and Traffic, have been adopted as part of the Buellton Municipal Code Section 10.01.010; and,

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Section 22507 and Section 23-11.1 of the Santa Barbara County Code authorizes the City Council, by Resolution, to designate limited, no parking, loading, and bus zones; and

WHEREAS, Section 23-11.1(a) of the Santa Barbara County Code designates that a red curb shall mean no stopping, standing or parking at any time except as permitted by the California Vehicle Code except that a bus may stop in a red zone marked or signed as a bus zone; and

WHEREAS, the City has received requests based on safety concerns from residents to apply parking restrictions to the west of the intersection of Highway 246 with Valley Station Drive; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interests of the community to restrict parking, with appropriate red curb markings, to provide safe zones for adequate line of sight for cars exiting Valley Station Drive onto Highway 246; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Buellton does hereby resolve, determine, and order as follows:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby finds that the above recitations are true and correct and, accordingly, are incorporated as a material part of this Resolution.

SECTION 2. The City Council hereby restricts parking for 145 feet on Highway 246 just west of Valley Station Drive (red curb), as shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference.

SECTION 3. The City Council hereby approves and directs to the installation (and subsequent maintenance) of red curb markings at the location as shown on Exhibit "A."

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution.
