Dog waste presents a serious problem in our City. It's one of the largest sources of water pollution. Dog waste is even more full of disease causing bacteria and parasites than other types of waste. These bacteria and parasites are harmful to humans and spread disease to other pets. If you don't pick up after your pet, you are putting other people and other pets at risk of getting sick. When dog waste washes into storm drains after it rains, that bacteria can be harmful to people, pets and marine life. Residents are asked to keep their neighborhoods and community clean by picking up dog waste and putting it in the trash.



### Swimming Pool and Spa Water Disposal

The City recently updated the Homeowner's and Mobile Cleaner's Guide to BMP's to include new guidance for management of swimming pool and spa water. This guidance was also included in the city's new Multi-Unit Residential Dwelling Guide to BMPs that was recently posted on the Stormwater Management webpage. The city requires that swimming pool and spa water must be dechlorinated to undetectable levels of < 0.1 mg/L, either chemically or by not adding chlorine to an uncovered pool or spa for 10 days. Use a swimming pool test kit to measure the chlorine prior to draining the pool or spa. Drain to landscaping whenever possible to conserve water.
